## STONY BROOK FILM FESTIVAL

FOR THE NOVICES AND THE BATTLE-SCARRED University film festivals rarely get as much attention as the one held at Long Island's Stony Brook University. For its 13th annual event, held July 17 - 26, 2008, the Stony Brook Film Festival played host to both first-time moviemakers and experienced players alike. Actressturned-director Mary Stuart Masterson was on hand to present her directorial debut, The Cake Eaters, and took home the jury's Best Feature award. Together with the movie's screenwriter and star, Jayce Bartok, she mingled with guests at the Passholder/Filmmaker Reception, an event fest founder Alan Inkles calls this year's highlight.

Krisztina Goda's Children of Glory, cowritten by Joe Eszterhas (the notorious screenwriter's first film since 1998), won over the audience to take home the award for Best Feature while The Stone Angel, featuring Ellen Burstyn and Ellen Page. won the Achievement in Filmmaking award for writer-director Kari Skogland.

"We want to continue to have a large pool of films to draw from," notes Inkles. "Our goal is to be on indie filmmakers' short list of festivals not to miss." www.stonubrookfilmfestival.com
